

A Whole Lot of Love

Muirfield Riding Therapy (MRT) began life in a muddy field with six borrowed ponies and a handful of hardy volunteers who had to battle with the elements. Riding was often cancelled because of bad weather, discovers **Deborah McLauahlin**.

ast forward through 26 years of service to the community; the East Lothian charity based at West Fenton now has over 220 volunteers and is at the forefront of therapeutic riding. "The reason I love MRT" says its Chairperson Susan Law, "is because it brings so many diverse people together for a common purpose."

This year, MRT has embarked on a campaign to find out and share just what it is that the riders, their parents and carers, and the volunteers feel about the organisation. And the results are showing there's a whole lot of love around, especially for the ponies. Rider David says "I love MRT because it's fun and I love the horses, especially Flora, Storm and Uist, but Macareaor is my favourite!"

Therapeutic riding and hippotherapy, using the equine as a therapeutic tool, provide multiple life-changing physical, learning, behavioural and social benefits to riders of all ages and various disabilities thanks to the movement, warmth and rhythm of the horse. Horses have a three dimensional movement which replicates the movement of a human at walk by 97%.

Riding therapy can bring life-changing social benefits too; all the fun of making new friends, bonding with animals, enjoying the outdoors and achieving personal goals can help, amongst other things, build self confidence and improve concentration. "The team at MRT have made such a difference helpina Eilish regain her strength and confidence after a long illness." a parent shared.

MRT's group physiotherapist Heather Falconer piloted a successful riding therapy service between NHS Lothian and Muirfield Riding Therapy in 2009. This pioneering partnership became the Therapeutic Riding Service, part of NHS Lothian's Children's Physiotherapy Service, run from MRT today. "The kids make it all worthwhile" says volunteer Michael. "It doesn't matter if you've had a bad week or the worst day of your life. For the 45 minutes that the session lasts, you can see how much pleasure and benefit the children get from the therapy and it feels really nice to be part of that."

And, you can be part of the team too.

New Introductions

Steve McCready highlights the new introductions at Smeaton Nursery this coming autumn.

Traditionally, autumn is recognised as the best time for planting and transplanting trees, shrubs and perennials. The soil is moist and several degrees warmer than even in late spring. This allows plants and trees the optimum time to establish new roots before the onset of winter and a head-start during the next growing season. In line with plant production, this is when the Nursery probably has it's largest range of hardy stock of trees, shrubs, fruitbushes and hedging plants available.

Each year we take time to secure plant stock from our established network of suppliers, not only to ensure availability of key lines throughout the season, but more importantly to source some of the more sought-after plants rarely stocked in the average garden centre. Here are some of the latest plant introductions which will soon be available at Smeaton Nursery.

Chaenomeles Salmon Horizon can be grown as a shrub but also makes an excellent wall plant for sun or shade. Saucer-shaped salmon-pink blooms from late winter into early summer.

Daphne Pink Fragrance is a charming dwarf evergreen shrub with deliciously fragrant flower clusters throughout

Edgeworthia Red Dragon is an exciting new colour break from this unusual winter-flowering shrub.

Kalmia Ginkona produces heavy clusters of pale-pink flowers intricately marked purple in June and July.

Magnolia Pink Beauty is another large-flowered variety flowering well as a young plant.

Skimmia Pabella makes a neat evergreen shrub with abundant bright red berries from early autumn.

Syringa Carpe Diem produces dense, heavily-fragrant flower panicles in late spring.

Weigela All Summer Red, as the name suggests, produces showy tubular flowers throughout the season on a compact bushy plant.

Cephalotaxus Korean Gold is a slow upright conifer with striking new growth.

Explore the wonders of flight with Captain Flap and Seaside Science Flying Fun at the Scottish Seabird Centre this summer.

This summer, the Scottish Seabird Centre, North Berwick, is exploring the wonders of flight as Captain Flap and the Seaside Science team offer a whole host of flight-inspired interactive activities, all included with admission to the centre.

From 1 July to 14 August (each Friday to Sunday) Captain Flap will host a science show exploring what makes flight possible whilst also undertaking a mission to remove marine litter from the Firth of Forth. In this 45-minute show, find out if the Captain will be able to rebuild the abandoned plane, Puffin One, and explore the importance of drag, thrust, gravity and lift to get the plane back into the sky.

From 4 July to 11 August, the Seaside Science team will host Seaside Science Flying Fun with different interactive activities taking place every day.

On Mondays there's Flying Fun with Bernoulli which will involve a range of science experiments looking at how the pressure of the air around us can make things move in unexpected ways! Tuesdays are all about Flying Fun with a Lift with the chance to make fizzy bottle rockets.

Depending on the weather, Wednesdays will focus on Flying Fun with Kites or Paper Aeroplanes. There is the chance to design your own kite or paper plane, which will then be put to the test to see who has made the most successful glider. On Thursdays, in Flying Straight, using cut-out birds and different weights, there will be a competition to see whose bird can travel in a straight line, aiming for the Bass Rock model.

Captain Flap said "This summer it's all about the wonders of flight and we will be exploring the amazing natural skills of our seabird friends to uncover how humans have taken to the skies! With interactive activities for families to enjoy it's going to be a funfilled few months and we will take things out into the areat outdoors as often as the weather will allow."

Plus, the puffins will be visible on the islands of Craigleith, Fidra and the Isle of May until early August and there will be gannet chicks then gugas on the Bass Rock right through the summer.

Capturing those Special Moments

Summer Holidays means summer snaps and the time when most of us dust our cameras down ready to capture holiday memories. Susan Heaton from Clear Photography shares some top tips for taking better photos, capturing special milestones and preserving precious memories for years to come... no matter what camera you have!













Get up Close... If you can, move in closer to your subject and crop in tight. You can also use your camera's zoom, if it has one. Always focus on their eyes. If you are looking for that lovely blurred-out effect, bring them as far away from the background as possible (i.e not flat up against a wall!) and if your camera allows it, set the aperture around f2.

Use the Light... Face your subject towards the light, preferably natural light where possible. If shooting on auto, avoid shooting towards the sun as this will confuse your camera and you will end up with a silhouette and possibly a bit of lens flare to boot! However, these can all be great effects once you get more confident. In fact the most flattering light is found in the shade!

Crouch Down... Photograph your subject at their level. If that means lying in the grass to photograph a crawling baby or climbing up onto a ladder to photograph your very tall uncle, then do it! The most engaging image is one that looks right into your subject's eyes. Getting up high and shooting down is also a very flattering angle for teens or adults – just be sure to get their eye contact.

Have Fun... The minute you try to pose or set something up, you lose the moment. Try to shoot things as they happen and if you do need to move children from their game, engage them in fun conversation or songs. Asking a child to sit there and smile really only ever ends up in either a forced grin or a scowl.

Don't Forget the Details... Not all photographs have to be of your child looking straight into the camera with a lovely grin on their face. What about little toes peeking out from under the high chair, some tiny fingers flicking through pages of their favourite book, a curl of hair falling over their face? Even a shot of their favourite toy or blanket can look great printed and put next to portraits and family shots in an album.

Photographers Sam and Susan Heaton, met at Art College, travelled the world, working in various countries to hone their love of photography. In 2005 they set up Clear Photography. Specialising in lifestyle photography their aim is to create modern, natural images. Their children and babies portrait photography is about minimal posing and direction. Susan says "Letting your kids be themselves always makes for a better and more natural image!"

So if you don't fancy taking the photographs yourself, why not hire Clear Photography for an hour or two next time you head to the beach or your favourite park? They even photograph underwater too! Perfect for capturing all those special moments this summer.







Pastry...

250g Plain or Wholemeal Flour

160g best Salty Butter

Put both ingredients into your food processor and whizz until it all comes together in a ball. Add a tiny weeny bit of water if it doesn't reach ball stage. Take out, plonk in the middle of a buttered pie or flan dish, flour your hands and just push the pastry out from the middle to the edges – it's so simple!

5 eggs (organic preferably) for a standard size flan dish, just add a couple more eggs and more cream for larger


350ml double cream A mix of herbs, salt, pepper and nutmeg **Grated Pecorino**

Big handfuls of basil, parsley, coriander, dill. If you fancy you can also add kale, spinach, chard, whichever is your favourite. If you're adding spinach or big leaves, just wilt and drain them first. Chop a couple of garlic cloves and add to egg mixture. Add salt pepper and teaspoon of nutmeg. Mix it all together, grate fresh pecorino over the top and bake for about half an hour or until the egg mixture is just set in the middle of the tart.

Smell the herbs, drink your sulphate-free vino... and enjoy!

Ya Bass! **A Timeless Muse**

Alan Rae from Fidra Fine Art reflects why for centuries the Bass Rock has proved an irresistible muse.





he volcanic plug that is Bass Rock sits a few miles off North Berwick's coastline. Its presence to people who live in East Lothian has provided a timeless, reassuring permanence. Something to gaze and marvel at throughout the changing seasons, something to come home to, a familiar friend.

To artists it's proved an irresistible muse. It will have been drawn in the sand, scratched on rock faces and chalked on pavements for centuries. Many of the great Scottish artists have been seduced by its charm. and mystery.

Alexander Nasmyth's famous Romantic interpretation of Tantallon Castle and Bass Rock painted around 1816 sits proudly in the National Galleries of Scotland. A dramatic composition of the castle and the rock against the elements. In 1818, JMW Turner visited Edinburgh and was drawn to Bass Rock, producing a series of sketches and watercolours that were to be used in Walter Scott's "The Provincial Antiquities and Picturesque Scenery of Scotland".


Later, artists such as Samuel Bough, William McTaggart, his grandson William MacTaggart, Alexander Fraser, Patrick William Adam, William Miller Frazer, John Campbell Mitchell, John Blair and William Gillies all found the lure of the rock irresistible.

More recently, John Houston's countless expressive studies of Bass Rock have made the rock almost emblematic of his work. Seen from various angles with the changing backdrop of weather and light, Bass Rock was the perfect focus for Houston to express his art. Similarly, Bass Rock appears frequently in the work of perhaps East Lothian's most famous artist. John Bellany.

Working today, Matthew Draper's fascination with Bass Rock has produced arguably the most dramatic studies of all. Equal in atmosphere and majesty to the landscapes of the great Scottish Romantic artists such as Alexander Nasmyth and Horatio McCulloch, Matthew's versions are both contemporary and timeless.

Ya Bass! runs from 6 August to 11 September at Fidra Fine Art in North Berwick and draws both from the past as well as from a host of successful contemporary Scottish artists working today. A wide range of styles and medium ensure a varied and interesting exhibition. A collection to gaze and marvel at!

Coast Lines

Two artists who met at art school are exhibiting together in North Berwick, Kim Williams talks to the artists about how coastlines have inspired and influenced both of them and their work.

nowned for its natural beauty and stunning coastline, East Lothian is a constant source of inspiration for Nartists and is often recreated on canvas, ceramic and paper. It is for this reason that two artists have chosen "Coast Lines" as a recurring theme for their work. Barbara Rowell (above left) and Ruth Thomas (above right) met while studying towards a BA in Art and Design at Edinburgh College of Art.

Last year Ruth initiated an innovative sketchbook exchange among artists based along the Firth of Forth and in her home region of New South Wales. These collaborative sketchbooks were exhibited in Australia and New Zealand as well as in North Berwick, during Fringe by the Sea.

Building on the success of this project, Barbara and Ruth have continued to collaborate in their shared studio at Fenton Barns where they focus on printmaking techniques for mounted works and artists books. They are delighted to return to Fringe by the Sea this year to show new work inspired by the marine environment and coastlines bordering the Firth of Forth and the Tasman Sea. This August, they'll exhibit their work at theDEN Studio in North Berwick. This lovely little creative studio and curated store, just off the High Street, will be home to a stunning display of artwork, all inspired by the coast, yet in very individual ways. The exhibition provides a unique opportunity – a chance to meet and chat with the artists and to view and buy artwork directly from them, from affordable cards through to mounted original prints, tapestry weavings and artists books.





Ruth Thomas

Dividing her time between Scotland and New South Wales in Australia. Ruth draws connections between the intertidal marine environments of these two geographically different countries. She says "I am inspired by the myriad of lines, patterns and formations found in the natural world but am increasingly concerned about the impact of human intervention."

Ruth is interested in the minutiae of the shoreline. She explores the estuaries of the Australian and East Lothian coastlines, regularly foraging in rock pools, observing, taking photos and collecting broken shells, driftwood, old nets and pieces of beach plastic. Her work conveys the beauty of the sea environment as well as portraying the tension between human existence and sustainability.

For Barbara Rowell, inspiration comes from mindful observation of the world around her; whilst walking in nature or urban areas, from reading and research or from her travels.

She loves to experiment with different processes and media and for this exhibition she is focusing on the techniques of Japanese Wood Block Printing. Barbara explains "I was left a Japanese Wood Block Print by my Aunt and I became fascinated by it and wanted to learn more about this ancient technique".

Her inspiration for this year's exhibition is the islands of the Forth Estuary. Barbara adds, "I've looked out of my kitchen window on Craigleith Island for ten years and it's a view that is firmly etched on my mind." Her work portrays a highly stylised view with a traditional Japanese interpretation. And what's more, Barbara uses the printing process to simplify the design and translate it into stunning abstract tapestry weavings which will sit side by side with the Japanese Woodblock Prints.






