

Apples are one of my favourite fruits. This probably stems from childhood memories of harvest-time and the glorious pies, cakes and juice made from the bounty of our garden's apple trees!

If you have apple trees, you may well be nagged by the question of just what to do with this bountiful produce. Simple – pick the fruit and bring it along to be pressed at **Gullane's Annual Apple Festival** on Sunday, 9 October. The trees in the village produce a wide variety of apples, both eaters and cookers and this community event encourages people to harvest as much local fruit as possible, bring it to the festival and help press it into juice. Festival Organiser, Adria Stubbs said "Before the festival, much of the fruit fell to the ground uneaten – areat for the wildlife, but now people benefit too!"

The focus of the festival has to be the genuine iron apple mulchers and presses used to press the apples into the most delicious juice, and everyone is invited to try their hand at pressing apples. Adria adds "Children, in particular, are fascinated by the whole pressing process and the festival makes a healthy and educational event out of picking fruit with the added value of no food miles". Some apples are also turned into delicious treats by enthusiastic cooks and bakers from around Gullane. Past festivals have produced cakes, apple leather, strudel, pastries, toffee apple muffins and the unusual but wonderful apple pizza.

Autumn Colour

Many garden plants regularly give a good display in autumn. **Steve McCready** of Smeaton Nursery looks at some of the most spectacular.

During this season, the Nursery looks amazing with berries and fruits combined with the incredible shades of autumn colour. As plants prepare to shut down for winter, triggered by the shortening days and colder nights, chlorophyll and glucose present in the leaves start to break down, resulting in change of colour. This display combined with gentle autumn sunlight can create a truly dramatic look in the garden. Here are some that never fail to impress.

Rhus (Stags' Horn Sumach) makes an impressive spreading large shrub. Its distinctive young shoots are covered with a felty-down, hence its common name.

Ginkgo (Maidenhair Tree) is an ancient species from prehistoric times with its curious fan-shaped foliage turning butter-yellow.

Cercidiphyllum (Katsura Tree) not only turns several shades but also smells like candy-floss in the damp autumn air.

Euonymus (Spindle Tree) have magnificent seed-capsules, characteristic corky-wings along their stems and brilliant shades of pink and crimson.

Enkianthus (Pagoda Bush) needs acidic conditions to thrive and produce the best show in autumn.

Cotinus (Smoke Bush) needs to be positioned so the sunshine can be seen passing through the foliage. This shrub positively glows!

Cercis (American Redbud) the bronze-leaved forms of this dramatic tree pale through varying shades.

Liquidambar (Sweet Gum) has large maple-shaped foliage which turns from soft-green to a whole spectrum of shades, butter-yellow to deepest plum – sometimes on the same tree!

Sorbus (Rowan) with many varieties producing a combination of spectacular berries and stunning autumn colour.

Disanthus cercidifolius prefers dappled shade and acidic soil to give the most reliable performance.

Be sure to witness the magical display this autumn at Smeaton Nursery.

f wooden furniture brings to mind cumbersome tables and orange varnish, you haven't been paying attention. 

Buoyed on by the successes of Team GB at the Rio Olympics, Kim Williams discovers how Community Sports Hubs are encouraging sports and a healthy lifestyle in our local community.

y childhood dream, as I plodded the country lanes on my rather unkempt pony, was to be plucked from obscurity by Olympic spotters and ride for my country at the next Olympic Games! Chances are, just like me, your children watching Olympians like Mo Farah, Max Whitlock and Andy Murray rack up gold medals in Rio, are suddenly inspired to go for gold themselves. Whether your child wants to be an Olympian or just become more active it's encouraging to know that here, in East Lothian, there is a community sports hub that is focused on putting East Lothian first, right from grass roots through to elite sports.

Community Sport Hubs Development Officer, Bengy Barsanti says "We call it the 'Olympic Bounce' - the Olympic Games provides an awareness of sport but sports clubs also need to market themselves and their products to prompt both parents and children into action."

It was for that very reason – to help improve the profile of sport in our local area, as well as encourage an active healthy lifestyle for all age groups - that six Community Sports Hubs were set up in towns across East Lothian. The hubs are a partnership between East Lothian Council, sportscotland and local community sports clubs which bring together key people involved in developing sport in the community. Bengy explains "The hubs were set up, not only to develop and improve sports provision, but to ensure that all the clubs actually started to speak to each other. We wanted to ensure there was a co-ordinated approach to sport and children had as many opportunities as possible, to try a wide range of activities. It turned out that there were often simple solutions, such as ensuring that not all practice sessions went on at the same time."

The hubs also proved to be an ideal platform for local sports clubs and key partners such as Active Schools and

Sports Development to meet, share good practice and exchange ideas. Which in turn has enabled clubs to focus on getting more people involved with sport, in particular girls, plus an emphasis on disability and inclusion. Bengy adds "It's about removing perceived barriers to sport or becoming a member of a club. We encourage everyone to come and talk to us, find out how they can be involved and in some cases we may even be able to reduce the financial burden of becoming a member of a club or sports group."

And it's not just about children. Perhaps the gold-medalwinning effort of our Men's Team Pursuit in cycling inspired you to head to your local velodrome? Or maybe Giles Scott's gold in sailing inspired you to take to the water? Whatever your reason for wanting to play sport, the hubs are committed to ensuring that there are a wide range of sports for people of all ages. Bengy says "People shouldn't stop sport just because they've left school, there needs to be capacity for adults to play recreational sport and we encourage and support all our clubs to make this provision."

Statistics after the 2012 Olympics suggest that over 50 per cent of children aged eight to 12 said the Olympics made them feel like being more active. With this in mind. now would be an ideal time to visit the hub's website www.activeeastlothian.co.uk. This website is the onestop shop for all things sport, it brings together all those in the community dealing with sport and activity. So, if your child has been running around all week twirling ribbons, or sprinting across the front lawn, this might just be the ideal time to sign them up for one of the many activities in our local community.

On the Couch

For a long time, Britons have considered the subject of therapy as taboo. Kim Williams discovers that this is no longer the case.

ot so long ago, many of us dismissed therapy as a Iifestyle indulgence, a short-cut used by those not strong enough to work out life's challenges on their own. something our friends across the Pond indulged in. Those who did see someone, to help with a relationship crisis, say, or an abusive childhood, kept it to themselves, as if needing help was shameful, even taboo. However, recent changes - notably government cuts, unemployment, higher costs of living and advances in technology - are subjecting us all to mounting stress and redefining our attitudes towards therapy in the process.

Everyone experiences periods of stress, sadness, grief and conflict, so when you're feeling off it can be hard to know if it's time to see a professional about the problem. So what are some signs it might be time to set up an appointment? Beverley White of Mae White Psychology reveals some indicators we can all look for during times we're feeling low.

Do your feelings change or impair your ability to function? Have you suffered a trauma and you can't seem to stop thinking about it? Are you using unhealthy coping strategies such as food or alcohol? Is it affecting your relationship? Bev explains "Often people get to a stage in life where they just can't cope, like a traffic jam – sometimes it resolves naturally, other times it piles up and we find ourselves needing support and that's OK." "I'll give a pen and notepad to my older clients and apps to the younger or more technical savvy" laughs Bev.

Another concern which people have when consulting professional help is the financial burden incurred. But therapy is now no longer the preserve of the wealthy. With lengthy waiting lists on the NHS, more of us are turning to private practice. 


