





The Renaissance Club has been named as the host venue of the 25th edition of the Scottish Senior Open from August 4-6, 2017.

The Renaissance Club, which opened in 2008, was designed by prominent golf course architect Tom Doak and incorporates 300 acres of pine forest on the coast of the Firth of Forth. Doak's design embraces the original dunes landscape and a number of natural obstacles on the course.

Host of the British Boys Amateur Championship in 2016, The Renaissance Club will also become a Final Qualifying venue for The Open Championship in 2018-2021.

Jerry Sarvadi, Managing Director of The Renaissance Club, said "We are honoured to have been approached by the European Seniors Tour to host the Scottish Senior Open on its 25th Anniversary and look forward to welcoming some of the great champions of golf to The Renaissance Club for this event in August. We are confident our par 71, 7,300-yard links golf course will provide a formidable challenge and an enjoyable experience for all of the participants in the event."

The event will incorporate the popular Alliance format, with amateurs given the opportunity to play alongside the professionals for the first two tournament rounds. A pro-am tournament will also take place ahead of the tournament on Thursday, August 3.

David MacLaren, Head of the European Senior Tour, added "We are delighted to have secured a new venue for the Scottish Senior Open as it celebrates a milestone 25th year on our tournament schedule. Gerald and the team at The Renaissance Club have been searching for an opportunity to showcase their world-class facilities and we are certainly looking forward to returning to the birthplace of golf later this year."

The festival will feature all kinds of live music, family entertainment, and an eclectic mix of street food and drink stalls. This is the second Hops in the Garden event, which raised nearly £9,000 for Leuchie House in 2016.

Conservation and education charity, the Scottish Seabird Centre has shared proposals to create a National Marine Centre for Scotland.

The centre plans to open in 2020, in time for VisitScotland's Year of Scotland's Coasts and Waters.

The project, which will cost in the region of £5.5million, focuses on delivering new and enhanced and conservation education programmes at the Centre and nationwide. It will transform the Seabird Centre to explore marine life above and below the waves. including seabirds. Working with partners throughout Scotland, it will provide a national hub to increase appreciation and understanding of Scotland's amazing marine wildlife and communicate ground-breaking marine research taking place nationwide. The National Marine Centre is a working title.

Simpson and Brown, the original Seabird Centre architects, who specialise in conservation projects, creative adaptation of existing buildings and the design of environmentally-sound initiatives, have been working closely with

multi award-winning exhibition designers Event Communications to develop the plans. A dedicated advisory group, led by Professor John Baxter, comprising scientists, researchers and practitioners, are providing input on marine-related content for the exhibitions and activities.

The proposed plans will create a new education centre for visiting school groups as well as provide outreach and online educational resources. Within the new visitor attraction, a range of interactive exhibitions will take visitors on a fascinating journey, exploring the marine world that is often hidden and inaccessible. There will be a new welcome area as well as new retail and catering facilities, which provide valuable income to support the charity's objectives. Plans also feature an observatory with 360° views which will allow visitors to view North Berwick's stunning coastline.

Leuchie House has Jaunched Leuchie Reserve, an Islay malt whisky produced as a limited edition to raise funds and to mark its fifth year as an independent charity.

The whisky is a 15-year-old single cask Islay malt, distilled at Bowmore Distillery in 2001, with a production run of only 216 individually numbered bottles. Whisky writer and expert, Charlie MacLean describes it as "An elegant example of the make with plenty of character. Pale gold in colour with initial scents of ripe pears and apples that soon give way to maritime notes, it is warming and lightly smoky as one would expect from Bowmore."

Carolyn Roulstone, Leuchie's Business Development Manager adds "We've had lots of local support to bring the whisky to market: from creating a striking and original design for the bottle labels, to writing tasting notes, to putting it on sale. It's the first time we've been involved in anything like this at Leuchie so it's a unique and exciting addition to our fundraising activities."



It's Summer and eating outside on the rare occasions we are able to is very special for me. As well as the BBQ, I often serve these ever-so-simple healthy oven-baked fish cakes.



As with all my recipes these tasty oven-baked fish cakes can suit everyone's taste and work well with a watercress salad and a simple olive oil and lemon dressing.

Chop three big handfuls of your favourite herbs. I use basil, dill, fennel tops and parsley. Peel and boil a few pounds of potatoes, not too mushy though! Then mix the herbs with the potatoes, add sea salt and black pepper and a teaspoon of turmeric and about a pound and a half of fish. I use smoked haddock, a few prawns and salmon chopped into small pieces. Squeeze half a lemon into the mix and roll into patties, a couple of inches wide and an inch deep.

Lay on greaseproof paper with a healthy oil spread over the paper. I use hemp oil, but any good oil will do. Spread a bit of oil on top too. Bake in the oven for about 30 minutes or just check to see if the fish is cooked.

Serve with salad, homemade saffron mayo (or Hellmann's is just as good) and a chunk of delicious bread. And if it's warm outside... what can I say?!

TASTE SENSATION

My mantra is 'why have three courses when you can have 13?' And, that is exactly what was in store when I was invited to Jo's Kitchen to be treated to a tasting and wine pairing menu, giving me a flavour of what this delightful Haddington-based bistro offers.

o's Kitchen is the brainchild of Jo Lawrence who has a passion for wonderful, fresh, seasonal, beautifully cooked food. Jo opened her bistro after a series of popup restaurants in East Lothian created a demand for her delicious home-cooking.

We are welcomed, with a glass of prosecco and seriously sublime quails egg benedict and salmon rillettes on ciabatta toast. The place looks simply stunning with fresh flowers and candles dotted about. And the snippets of conversation from invited guests make it clear people are here for the food and they love it.

As we take our seats in the Pheasant Room, the first of the wines to be paired with the first of the dishes arrives. And from this moment it is clearly evident that passion and quality are the hallmarks of Jo's Kitchen. From preparation to presentation, every dish is lavished with care and attention. Everything is either sourced locally or made by the team and Jo prides herself on her use of sustainable products and seasonal cooking.

Our first plate of food was one of my favourite dishes and a combination which never fails to disappoint - salt and pepper squid with citrus mayo. Followed by dishes that hinted towards fusion; lemon and thyme chicken skewers with Indonesian satay sauce and Asian pork balls with chilli jam and lime. Delightful combinations, with flavours that were never overpowering. The last of the starters was Highland mussels, unusually but wonderfully combined with smoked haddock and whisky.

The first of the bite-sized mains arrived, a sliver of Barbary duck breast with passion fruit and bourbon jus and rosemary roasties looked just as tempting as its predecessors, and smelt and tasted fantastic. The following dishes; sea bass on a lobster bisque risotto, flat iron steak with handcut chips, chicken escalope with a parmesan and basil crust and fresh tomato salsa, were all beautifully presented and everything on the taster-sized plates was faultless. The dishes just kept giving.

Our evening ended with quintuple (yes five!) gorgeously presented and mouthwatering puddings; chocolate pannacotta tart, mango Eton mess, dark chocolate salted caramel pot, black cherry Bakewell with raspberry mascarpone and white chocolate and peppermint mousse.

Asking my fellow guests their favourite dish of the evening created interesting debate as each dish was mouthwateringly mulled over. So, if we could design our own Jo's Kitchen tasting menu, it would be double portions of mussels; double portions of Barbary duck; and double again of dark chocolate salted caramel pots. But don't just take our word for it, you really should find out for yourself. After all, each dish is wonderfully delicious and they won't judge you for licking the plate.

THE PUFFINS ARE BACK!

Puffin season has begun at the Scottish Seabird Centre, North Berwick. Visitors to the 5-star Centre have the opportunity to control the interactive cameras to zoom in on the live puffin action on the islands of Craigleith, Fidra and the Isle of May National Nature Reserve. It's also possible to see the amazing 'clowns of the sea' with a range of boat trips that take in the local islands.

The Isle of May is the largest puffin colony on the east coast of Britain with approximately 92,000 puffins calling the island home from April to early August. Craigleith and Fidra feature as part of the Seabird Centre's SOS Puffin Project, which has been running for 10 years and has seen over 1,100 volunteers getting involved to help puffins gain access to their burrows by cutting down the tree mallow.

Younger visitors to the Seabird Centre have the chance to visit for free. Those who present a 'puffin portrait' until the end of July at the admissions desk will be awarded with a Discovery Centre

ticket for their artistic efforts. Each 'puffin portrait' should feature a drawing of the child with a puffin, articulated in any artistic medium.

Alex Turnbull, Discovery Centre Manager, said "With the Firth of Forth being home to tens of thousands of puffins between April and early August and with the Isle of May being the largest puffin colony on the east coast of Britain, North Berwick is the ideal location for puffin spotting.

"Visitors of all ages love zooming in on the puffins with our interactive live cameras. And to see them when out on our Seabird Catamaran Cruise, Three Islands Seabird Seafari or Isle of May Landing is really quite special.

Finishing off on Sunday evening is the traditional Tribute Night (Dirty Harry and The Springsteen Sessions).

Other venues include Abbey Church, Masonic Hall and North Berwick Fry – allowing lots of other gems to be featured. Amongst these great offerings are The Honeycutters, Aly Bain and Phil Cunningham, Tommy Smith and Brian Kellock, QuattroJazz, The Police Choir and Philip Contini's Be Happy Band.

plans are in the pipeline for a couple of magic shows. There, of course, will be a series of 'in-conversations' with a number of authors.

And, with a full childrens' programme, from Mr Boom to the East Bay donkeys, Fringe by the Sea 2017 is a must-visit festival for all the family and all generations!





'Take my hand'

...follow in the footsteps of the young Robert Louis Stevenson and relive the exploration of the town, as he did some 150 years ago.

Treasured Memories exhibition is currently on at the Coastal Communities Museum in North Berwick. As part of this exhibition there is a section devoted to young Robert who, along with other members of his extended family, used to holiday in the town during the 1860s.

The family usually stayed in a large house on East Bay and during their stay Robert and his cousins spent their days playing on the beach, swimming in the sea, clambering over rocks, exploring the local coastline and town, taking a boat out to the islands and playing some golf.

It has been said that many of the local characters and locations were to influence RLS's later literary works. Treasure Island is said to have evolved from Robert's visits to Fidra Island.

While there have been changes to North Berwick in recent years, some streets and specific locations have remained the same for centuries. Linking with the past, the Coastal Communities Museum has devised a walking Treasure Hunt which takes participants through a series of 12 questions to attain treasure. Great fun for all the family, with all 'twelve steps' easily accessible and located in and around the town centre.

Now is the time to get some fresh air and exercise, while testing your local knowledge. Treasure Trail leaflets are only available from the Coastal Communities Museum.







Hot on the heels of the Chelsea Flower Show, the East Lothian Garden Trail is back for its second year with 12 glorious and inspirational gardens to visit throughout East Lothian.

The 4pm bell has been rung signalling the end of the Chelsea Flower Show, gardening gloves have come off and battles fought to bag bargain begonias and cut price campanula. Known for pushing design boundaries, the world-famous flower show also inspires the home gardener. The gates at Chelsea might be closed, but you can still pick up ideas for your humble plot by visiting some of the many gardens throwing open their gates to the public during 2017, under the Scotland's Gardens banner.

Scotland's Gardens Open Scheme have organised an East Lothian Garden Trail which will take place from 28 June to 2 July. The Trail features 12 of the best gardens in East Lothian, most of which are not generally open to the public, providing a rare opportunity to visit them. Six gardens have featured in the previous Trail two years ago, new gardens have been added and new ground broken with the addition of the Musselburgh Allotments. You'll also find sculpture and artwork from some of Scotland's leading artists exhibited in one of the gardens.

The trail aims to raise cash for charity with 60% of the proceeds going to Scotland's Gardens' beneficiary charities and the remainder shared equally between Trellis and MND Scotland.

On the Trail you'll see splendid planting in a mix of settings, some many generations old, some relatively recent; both coastal and inland; both rugged and manicured. Crammed full of unusual plants and inspiring planting combinations the gardens are a plantaholic's dream, full of ideas and inspiration. And, with those who created the gardens on hand, you'll get a chance to find out just what inspired their plentiful plots.

Picking the brains of the owner, or custodian for many of these gardens are held in custody for the next generation - must surely be one of the highlights of wandering around the fruits of someone else's labour. Definitely worth taking the gardening gloves off for!
