

SIMPLE VALENTINE'S SODA LOAF

Bake a loaf for the one you love this Valentine's Day. And the best thing about this loaf? It takes literally two minutes to make and there's no kneading either! All you need to do is mix all the dry ingredients together and add the buttermilk or organic Greek yoghurt and bake until golden brown or when you tap it, the loaf sound hollow. It's really that simple and tastes delicious!

WHAT YOU NEED

12 oz flour (I use about 8oz of spelt flour and 4 oz of buckwheat. But you could use pretty much any flour, so try a few different combinations.

One large tub (between 250-300ml) of buttermilk or Greek yoghurt

One teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda Salt and pepper to taste One teaspoon of turmeric

Oregano and one teaspoon of caraway seeds (or try your own mix of your favourite herbs and seeds)

WHAT YOU DO

Mix all the dry ingredients together. Then mix in a tub of buttermilk or Greek yoghurt. Shape (it should be sticky) and place on non stick greaseproof paper. Use a bit more flour on your hands to shape it if the loaf is sticking too much. Put in the oven 200°C fan assisted for 20 minutes.



SAYING NO TO SINGLE USE PLASTIC

The UK produces billions of pieces of throwaway plastics such as plastic straws, plastic cutlery, plastic cups and coffee cups every year. Yet a huge percentage of these are not recycled - instead they end up littering our streets, our beaches and washing out to sea. In fact each year, 8 million tonnes of plastic is dumped in our waterways where it pollutes our oceans and harms marine wildlife. It also mars our otherwise beautiful beaches and coastlines. And with headlines such as "UK Faces Build-Up of Plastic Waste" and "Tidal Wave of Waste Hits Storm Beaches" on an almost daily basis, the problem is not going away. But, there are things we as individuals and we as a community can do, to try and stop the problem. And it's heartening to see just how many people in our local community really are saying no to plastic.





STEAMPUNK'S NEW YEAR'S REVOLUTION

Steampunk's Catherine Franks tells us how you can be part of the revolution!

Steampunk Coffee is a business with a purpose at its heart. Coffee is, after all, about bringing people together and making the world a slightly better place. For 2018, instead of making resolutions, Steampunk has begun a New Year's Revolution. We are taking positive action to minimise our environmental impact and maximise our community impact. Each month we are focusing on a different area, offering simple and easy ways people can come along with us on this journey - it's going to be a fun (and empowering) ride!

In January we began by tackling the issue of disposable coffee cups. As a coffee business this is a problem we need to take ownership of and do something about. Did you know there are 2.5 billion cups going into landfill every year in the UK alone? We say no thank you! So, we launched several initiatives to encourage the use of reusable cups and to compost the cups we do use. And we've been overwhelmed with the support we have received. We have seen some really positive changes and will continue working hard on this throughout 2018.

In February we launch 'Naked Coffee'. All the taste and none of the waste when you buy your beans loose from our roastery/cafe. Simply bring your own jar or pick up one of our canisters and then refill as and when you need plus you pay for just the coffee, not the packaging! As well as a considerable cost saving you're preventing more plastic from being thrown away. We are also looking at moving to fully biodegradable packaging but this will be a year-long project for us as a business.

We have plenty more great ideas up our sleeves for March and the rest of the year too, so stay tuned! Find out more by following us on Facebook or Instagram and please get involved, whether it is with us, in your own communities or in small ways in your own personal life. Together all of our little changes can have a huge impact!









THE PLASTIC STRAW EFFECT

Our Food and Drink Columnist Amanda Farnese-Heath takes to the streets of North Berwick with her very own straw challenge.

The idea of trying to effect change can sometimes be such a hard mountain to climb as we are all so busy with our own lives that more often than not we simply do nothing!

My 2018 pledge was to start very small and just try to change one thing so I've taken on the straw challenge. The idea is, that if everybody takes on a very small challenge to help reduce single-use plastics, whether it be straws or plastic cutlery then all these little changes can make a huge difference. Because if by 2050 we don't stop using plastic there will be more of the stuff in the oceans than fish.

So far every shop I've visited in North Berwick who use plastic straws has been more than happy to take a box of my biodegradable alternatives. I also have names of suppliers for cutlery and alternative for polystyrene take-away containers. Any shop, bar or cafe that still has plastic straws just message me and I'll come and drop a box off for you and the suppliers details.

Let's all work together to keep our oceans clean.




SIMPLE TIPS TO STOP PLASTIC POLLUTION

We can all do something to reduce the amount of plastic that enters the ocean. Here are some simple ways which will help make a difference:

- 1. Reuse or refuse the straw (unless it's biodegradable).
- 2. Use your own flask or cup for take-away tea or coffee.
- 3. Switch to reusable bags.
- 4. Don't buy bottled water use your own refillable water bottle.
- 5. Avoid excessive food packaging and if possible buy in bulk. Consider the product-to-packaging ratio of items you buy and if possible buy the largest size.
- 6. Participate in a beach clean-up or simply pick up any rubbish you see on your daily walk.
- 7. Recycle!





I've been living in North Berwick since 2010 and have spent a great deal of time photographing our beautiful East Lothian coastline. In that time I've witnessed the volume of plastic on our beaches grow at a steady and alarming rate. Increasingly I'm having to remove plastic in some form from the areas I am photographing. With an estimated 8 million tonnes finding its way into our oceans every year this is a problem that none of us can continue turning a blind eye to. As a photographer I have the luxury of being able to edit out the plastic from my images but the reality is if we don't drastically reduce our reliance on it, plastic and its effects on the marine environment will impact us all. We all need to act now.

From 1st March I will be showcasing a series of coastal images in Steampunk Coffee in North Berwick. I hope with these images I can visually highlight just how much of an impact even one small piece of plastic can have on the coastline.

Prints of the same scenes without the plastic pollution will be available for sale and I will be donating 10% of the profits to the charity City to Sea.

11 March Mothering Sunday



BE KINDER TO YOU...

As the new year is well and truly underway and we find ourselves, once more, in the month associated with love, **Bernie Petrie** asks us to take this opportunity to see just how kind we are being to ourselves.

My specialty is in the field of self-love, and one of the first steps in seeing just how kind you are being to yourself, is to check your inner dialogue. As human beings we all have a pretty permanent inner dialogue – referred by some as the inner chatter, inner critic or the voice in our head – we are rarely left alone because of its continuous dialogue. It's the voice that tells you "go on have the extra...serving of cake or glass of wine" and it's the same voice you beat yourself up with afterwards. It's really kind of sneaky that way.

To give you a sense of how much self-talk matters, imagine for a moment that you wake up tomorrow but instead of getting out of bed as an adult you are once again your two-year-old self. Now think of the things you will do that day from the moment you wake till the moment you go to bed. Picture the number of times you have sworn at yourself or called yourself an idiot or worse. See how often you have compared yourself to others, judged others or given away your happiness for the sake of someone else or because you don't believe anything is possible.

Imagining a two-year-old child giving themselves such abuse is horrible isn't it? In fact it's almost impossible to picture a two-year-old judging others or saying "that will never happen"! Yet picturing a two-year-old venting their true feelings when their happiness is jeopardised maybe not be so hard. What we do to ourselves, each and every day, with both our inner-

dialogue and denying our own needs means that the parts of us that are small and vulnerable, like a two-year-old, take a daily battering and the parts that honour what we truly want are possibly screaming inside. Now, can you see why kinder self-talk and honouring our own needs is so important?

As well as picturing yourself as a small child more frequently to improve your own self-talk, why not spend a few minutes at the end of each day to pause and reflect? Share a few kind words and thoughts with yourself and appreciate the things in your day that you might otherwise not have noticed or take for granted.

Journalling on a nightly basis, for just for a few minutes, is one of the kindest things we can do and ensures that we are able to reboot each and every day just like the molecules of our body do. Journalling nightly ensures a much better night's sleep, in the same way a child sleeps when they feel loved and cherished after a parent has tucked them up for the night.

So in this month of love why not commit to 28 days of kinder self-talk and 28 days of bedtime journalling – loving and cherishing what you want to retain and letting go of the small stuff that your two-year-old self still remembers really doesn't matter!

Growing up today is very difficult. Teens and young people are often overwhelmed with stress from school and families, from pressures, from unrealistic expectations. But there is help at hand.

Today's teens are overwhelmed with stress from school and families, from pressures and unrealistic expectations. Social media is constantly drawing their attention. Impossible standards are being set much closer to home, not by celebrities and models but by classmates and friends. With social media, teens can curate their lives and the resulting feeds show only the best and most enviable moments while concealing efforts, struggles and the merely ordinary aspects of day-to-day life. And there's growing evidence that these images and unrealistic expectations are causing distress for many teens.

Psychological Therapist, Yvonne Earl (pictured inset) specialises in psychological therapy for young people and teenagers and has seen teenagers dealing with some very complex health issues, many of them stress-related. Unrealistic expectations, the pressure to look and act a certain way, academic pressure and the impact of social media can cause depression and anxiety in the young. Yvonne says "I have spent most of my working life in child and adolescent psychological health and I believe that now, more than ever, young people's mental health is important especially with all the social networking that impacts them."

Psychological therapy, such as Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) and Mindfulness Based Cognitive Therapy (MBCT) are talking therapies which aim to help you feel better by identifying unhelpful patterns of thought and behaviour. They can help provide teens

and young people with tools to stop their habitual automatic reactions and negative feelings which are often harmful to themselves and to others. It teaches them ways to engage with life's difficulties in order to develop useful patterns of thinking and behaviour. Awareness of this kind also helps a young person notice signs of stress or anxiety earlier. Yvonne explains "We offer tools within psychological therapy to enable someone to change the way they think and feel about their experiences. A growing body of evidence has found that when you are given the tools to manage problems by changing the way you think and behave, you feel less stressed, anxious and depressed."

Yvonne who has over 26 years' experience working in the field of child and adolescent psychiatry is now bringing her expertise to **North Berwick's Barefoot Sanctuary**. She specialises in the areas of; self esteem, depression, self-harm, exam stress, anxiety, OCD, phobias, parenting problems and family work, eating disorders, bereavement and lack of confidence. Yvonne offers individual sessions which follow a structured process and teach a range of techniques including CBT and mindfulness which can be used to help relieve and manage symptoms.

One of Yvonne's clients sums up how CBT helped her "Through sessions with Yvonne, I learnt the crucial techniques to be able to change my mindset and feel well again. I couldn't be more grateful for Yvonne's help and support, I am truly a different person now."





...CARRY OUT AN MOT ON MY FINANCES


